“CHRIS CACCAMISE / ERIK HANSON”

Eleven Rivington | Through April 20

Caccamise constructs everyday objects (a coffee cup, a CD, a copy of *Artforum* magazine) out of mundane materials (paper, glue, enamel paint). More interestingly, he also builds words. Buoyant block letters spell out phrases teased from pop-culture consciousness: “The Long and Winding Road” and “Lost in Space No One Can Hear You Scream.” In the back room, Hanson shows endearing little canvases in frosting-thick impasto. Each depicts a color chart with hues named for pop songs and was dashed off in the time it took the artist to listen to a CD. Through April 20. (Eleven Rivington, 11 Rivington St. 212-982-1930.)
